On the 9th we have solemn act of Remembrance when the churches of Weedon join together to lead us in remembering those who gave their lives in warfare, both the two world wars and more recent conflicts. After the service in the United Reformed Church Chapel we move to the war memorial in the cemetery to observe the two minutes silence.

For the remainder of November we remember Jesus as our King leading to the festival of Christ the King on 23rd November. Then the church's year starts all over again with Advent, the season of waiting for the coming of Jesus. That means Christingle when all are welcome to come to receive a Christingle orange. Lots to think about and join in.
